# **9.1** Principal

December 11, 2024 Once in a generation, a teacher like Sandy Mellon comes along. Her impact reaches far beyond her classroom - she has been a mentor to all of us. She will be missed and we wish her a wonderful retirement.

CO2 levels - the school board monitors CO2 levels as "fresh air" checks that the government requires in schools since Covid. The indoor CO2 level rises this time of year, as we keep windows closed and the heating system is on. CO2 should remain below 1500ppm to have what would be considered "fresh air" - the optimal balance of oxygen and carbon dioxide. To achieve this, we open classroom windows on prep time, recess, lunch, and at times throughout the teaching day (as is reasonable). The school board sent someone this week to remind us to open windows for fresh air (oxygen from outside) as a few of the levels were around the 1500 mark. Two thirds of our schools rely on natural ventilation (as opposed to having mechanical air exchangers in the school).

Our dog project is on hold for now. It was a huge success with the kids, but Onyx was starting to seem a bit overwhelmed by it all. For his sake, we will press pause for the time being.

Our Open House will take place on Jan 16 with am and pm sessions. Mme Jessica has helped prepare a flyer which is posted to our website and our facebook page, and I have put a request in with DDO to have it on their electronic billboard for the 10 days leading up to Jan 16. All families are welcome, and we are going to strongly encourage our K4 and K5 families to make the effort to be there. It will be a

great way for them to see and understand the next steps of schooling beyond the preschool years.

Thank you to teachers and staff for being such great educators and even better humans. This is not an easy job, full of unseen demands and stresses. They are, by far, the best people to help raise your kids.

Thank you to parents for coming out in great numbers for parent-teacher interviews. It is so important to have this partnership for the sake of your kids' development.

Thank you to Home and School for the bake sale and book fair that day as well. The book fairs (from last spring and this fall) brought in close to \$200 (in Scholastic reward money) per teacher for them to buy books for their classrooms. Santa came early for them, and they are all so grateful.

Thank you to everyone who helped out at Bingo Night, it was a huge success again and goes such a long way to helping our families in need.

We have spirit week next week, thank you to all the teachers who organized that. It's a really fun week in schools, despite the craziness, and that's a nice way to celebrate it.

Grade 6 fundraising - they netted about \$3000 in fundraising profit with their cookie sales.

Hockey 4 Youth: the program is up and running. Thank you to the parent volunteers for making it possible for the girls to learn to play hockey. It is a fantastic initiative.
